## New Morning Duty Procedures starting $Nov \ 14^{th}$

**Morning Duty Schedule (8:05 - 8:20am)** Zones: Side playground and pavement (Grade P-2 students) / Front playground and pavement to circle steps (Grade 3-6 students). When students get off the bus, they will now go to their designated playground areas above. These zones will be supervised by teachers starting at 8:05am, not before. The entrance bell will ring at 8:20 and students will line up and meet their teachers at their regular entrance doors. Teachers will communicate with you what line colour they will be using for their class.

**Indoor/Rainy days:** Students enter at 8:05am and will go straight to their classrooms where their teachers will be.

**Breakfast Program:** will remain the same and students can come in, make a choice and take it back outdoors with them or wait until they enter at 8:20 to choose something if they want it.

## **Remembrance Day and Indigenous Veterans Day**

On November 8, we honour Indigenous Veterans who have served in missions in times of war and peace. While not often enough acknowledged, the military service of First Nations, Inuit and Métis in Canada has deep roots.

On November 11, we pause and reflect on the sacrifice of our veterans, past and present. Lest we forget.

We will have our Remembrance Day Assembly for students on **Nov. 9th at 1:00pm** in the gym. If students would like to dress in their uniforms or regalia, we encourage them to do so for this assembly. We encourage you to talk to your children about this assembly as it is a more somber tone then other assemblies throughout the year. If you would like to attend as a veteran or service member, please email <u>Mr. Tuck</u> so that we can ensure you are looked after when you arrive.

## **Inclement Weather**

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather.

It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- All schools are open, but some or all buses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

• Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and

• Walking students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

## **SCHOOL PROCEDURES**

Please ensure you are aware of the procedures to help our school run smoothly and safely.

- Safe Arrival Please report an absence for your student in advance, up to the start of the school day on the date of your child's absence by:
  - **1. Toll-Free Number** Parents/guardians can call **1-833-582-6940** to report future absences using an automated system.
  - 2. SchoolMessenger App Parents/guardians can download the SchoolMessenger app for Android and iOS devices and will sign up using their PowerSchool username (full email).
- We require a valid working phone number, so we can contact you
- Supervision starts 8:05 do not arrive before
- Please ensure your child arrives on time to limit disruptions to important routines
- Please call/email for an appointment with the principal, vice principal or teachers to ensure availability
- Visitors must sign in at the office, wear a visitor badge and state a reason for each visit.
- Visitors are not permitted to roam the school as we protect our instructional time and ensure the safety of students, staff and visitors too
- Teachers will generally respond to email within 2 business days

- We are a scent and nut aware school
- No pets! For your safety, student safety and pet safety (Service Dogs permitted)
- No smoking or vaping on school property
- Proper forms are required for the administration of <u>any</u> medications. No medications will be administered to students by school staff during school hours unless it is necessary and prescribed by a health care professional. This includes any over the counter medications.
- Please ensure we have current custody or court documents if applicable
- Talk to your child about crosswalk safety
- All students will ride their assigned bus/buses only
- Children are not permitted to open outside doors or answer the doorbell
- Hold Secure Practice, Lockdown Practice and Fire Drills We will practice these security measures throughout the year to develop an awareness and expectations for safety.
- No Driving/Parking on School Property
- There is absolutely no driving/parking on school property for unauthorized vehicles without prior arrangements during the school day. Please drive slow and watch for crosswalks. When buses arrive, do not drive, or walk around them. This protects all of us and especially our students.
